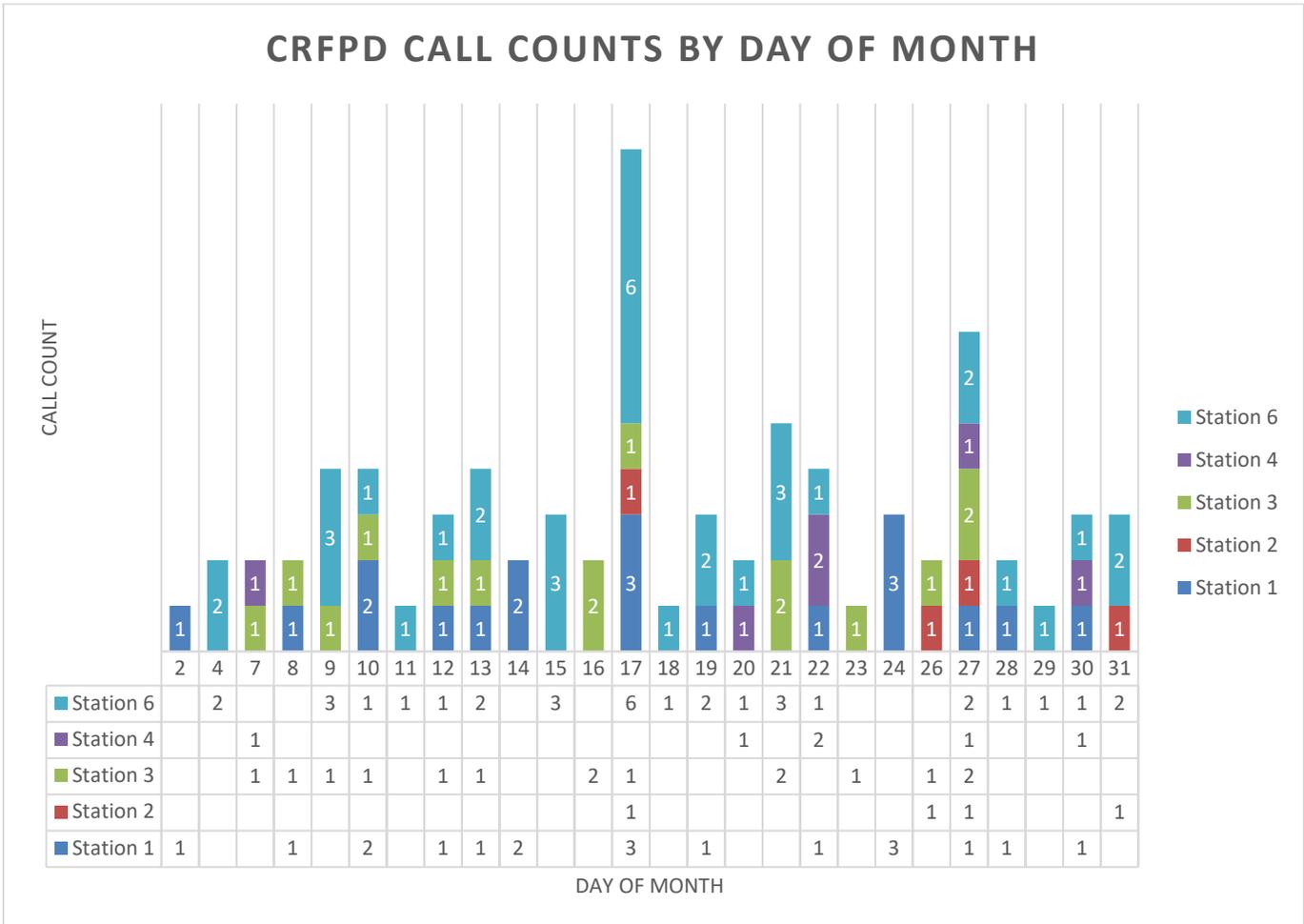

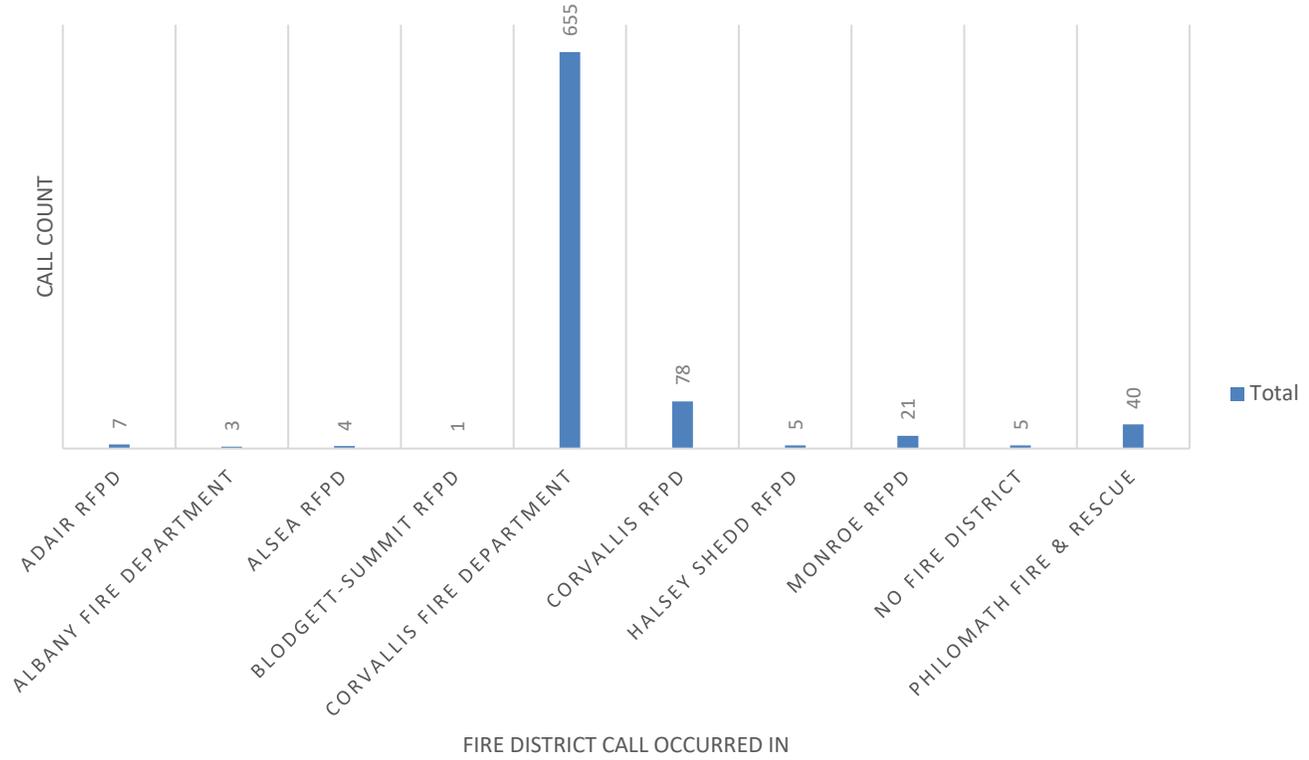

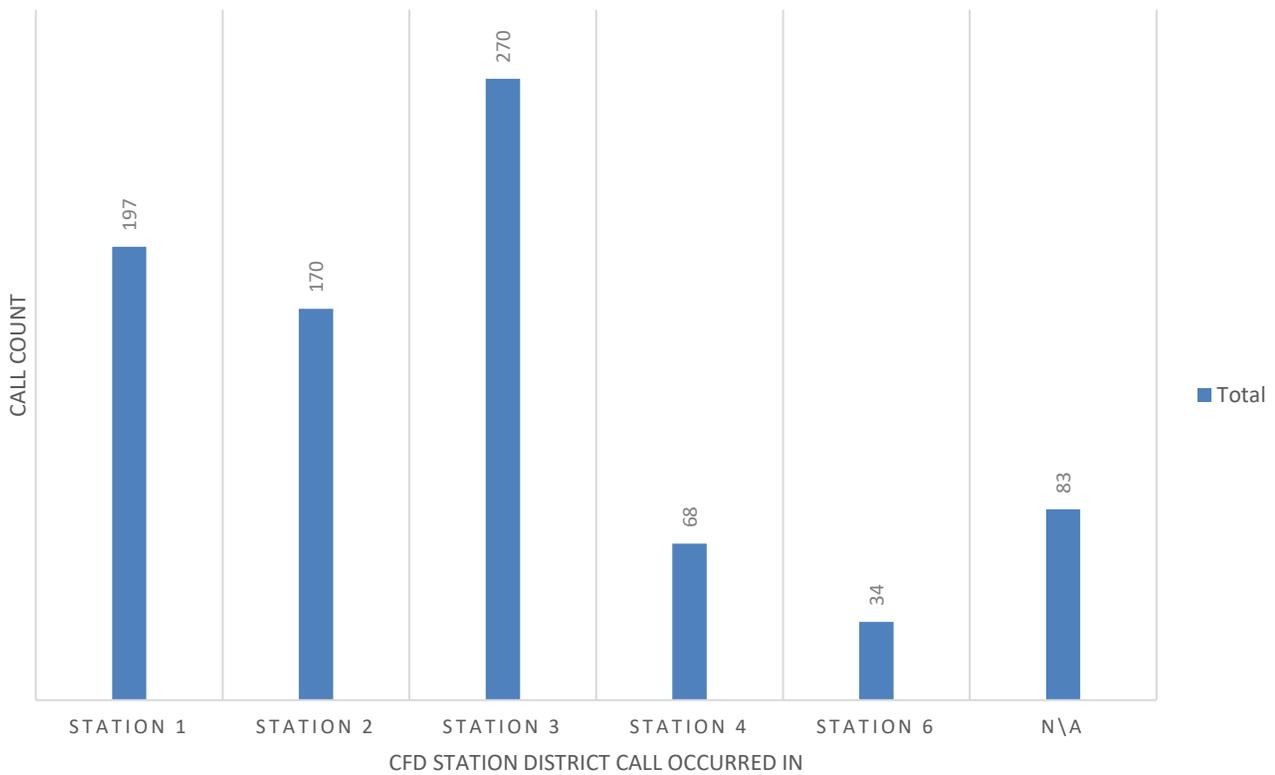
CRFPD CALL COUNTS BY DAY OF MONTH



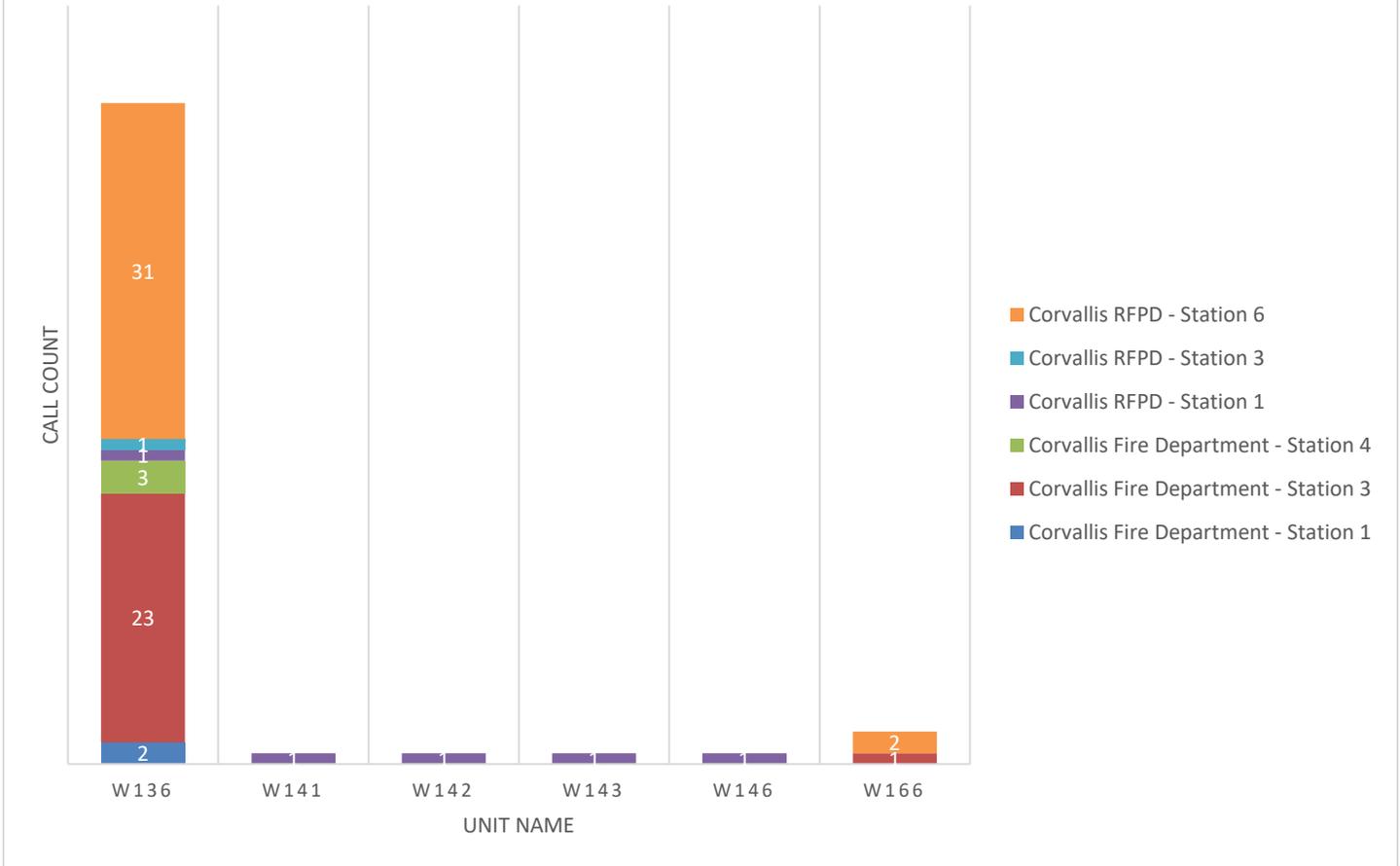
CFD CALL COUNT BY FIRE DISTRICT CALL OCCURRED IN

STATION 6 LT REPORT

New Business:

- Doorbell is being worked on. Victory Electric came and diagnosed that the chime was no longer operating as it should. Purchased replacement chime and have scheduled Victory to return and install new chime and make needed connections to transmitter located at front door.
- Turnout washer was serviced by Alliance. Issues with appropriately cleaning turnouts seems to be due to a lack of water entering machine. This was caused by excess amount of sediment on the screens of the inlet hoses as well as aged and worn hoses. Hoses have been replaced with new. Recommend adding cleaning inlet screens semi-annually to the annual maintenance schedule in place of servicing turnout washer. Alliance stated that an annual maintenance of the machine is not necessary, and they don't have any such service. Alliance also mentioned that the machine is dated, and we should begin budgeting for a replacement.
- December in service time was outstanding. This is largely due to recent advancements in RRV ranks and Winter

Break from school. I don't anticipate this being the "new normal", but we will continue seeing better in-service times with the recent advancements.

- On that note, we have 4 RRV's that are currently in hiring processes with CFD and other departments. There is a chance we lose some higher-ranking RRV's early 2026. Pending results of these processes, I am beginning to plan for next academy.
- Rural Resident Volunteer Firefighter of the Year Award. Proposal attached.

Proposal for Rural Resident Volunteer Firefighter of the Year Award

Purpose: The reinstatement of the Rural Resident Volunteer of the Year Award. The award recognizes exceptional service and dedication by an RRV who goes above and beyond in training, response, and commitment to the department.

Background: Previously referred to as the Intern of the Year Award, resident volunteers were recognized for the commitment to the program and department from 2007-2021. The names of the award recipients were engraved into a plaque that is proudly displayed in the lobby of Station 6. There was a financial incentive associated with the award in the form of a gift card (unknown amount). After 2021, the award stopped being issued for unknown reasons. Upon investigating the reasons for the stoppage and process for which the award recipient was chosen, I was unable to find any reasons or documented process.

How it works: Each RRV will be given a chance to submit a nomination for the award recipient based on criteria stated below. This must be submitted via email to the Station 6 LT, prior to the end of January. The Station 6 LT will tally nominations to determine the top receiving candidates of at least 2 and up to 4. The Station 6 LT will then send the list of nominees to the voting committee consisting of Station 6 LT, Training Chief, A-Shift BC, B-Shift BC, and C-Shift BC (to include D-Shift BC starting for award year 2027). They will each receive one vote. The Station 6 LT will submit the winner of the committee vote to the Board Chair as the Rural Resident Volunteer Firefighter of the Year Award recipient. The board will purchase the VISA gift card in the dollar amount specified and present this to the recipient. Station 6 LT will take plaque to R3 for engraving. In the instance of a tie between two nominees, the award will be shared as co-recipients, each receiving half of the allotted gift card amount. If there is a tie of three or more nominees, there is to be a committee discussion, followed by a re-vote, until there is a clear recipient and/or co-recipients.

Award Criteria:

- Service Commitment: Meeting or exceeding shift requirements, consistent attendance at Tuesday Drills, and willingness to step up when needed.

Courage, Honor, Commitment and Teamwork



- Professionalism & Conduct: Demonstrating courage, honor, commitment, teamwork, and adherence to department policies and mission.
- Skill & Performance: Strong performance on incidents, sound decision-making, and continual improvement of firefighting and emergency medical service skills.
- Training & Development: Active participation in required and optional training, pursuit of certifications, and a commitment to personal and departmental growth.
- Leadership & Initiative: Leading by example, mentoring newer members, taking initiative on projects, committees, or problem-solving within the station.
- Community Engagement: Positive interaction with the public, involvement in outreach, education, or community events, and representing the department well.
- Overall Impact: The firefighter's overall contribution to department morale, readiness, and mission over the award period.

Benefits: The award reinforces departmental core values, boosts morale and retention, and encourages positive role modeling among members. It also highlights the importance of resident volunteers, supports leadership development, and strengthens community trust by publicly acknowledging outstanding public service. The financial gain of the gift card will also have a significant impact on the RRV.

Obstacles to Overcome: Ensuring that the process remains transparent and fair, retaining the trust of the RRV's and integrity of the award. This will be done through the process that was listed above.

Associated Cost: \$317 annual commitment from the board of directors, to include \$300 VISA gift card, \$17 for engraving to be added to the name plate on the plaque. The current plaque has four remaining slots and then in year 2029, the purchase of an additional plaque will have to be made, current cost is roughly \$175 for a new plaque consisting of 18 name plates.
