- Residents: 11
- Community Volunteers: 0
- Currently, we have 4 Crew Leaders, 5 Apparatus Operators (3 are Crew leader Trainees), and 2 AO Trainees. Additionally, 6 are Tender operators.
- 6 of the RRVs/RCVs are state licensed EMTs. The other 5 are in process. They have all completed the class portion of EMT School.
- Hoover officially obtained his EMT.
- Staff anticipates numerous vacancies being created through 2022 as a result of regional hiring.
